Re: Trigger Source Monitoring and Reporting Violation/Ground Water Rule

In August 2014, Kingsland Water Supply Corporation failed to collect all required samples following a positive bacteriological sampling event. We were notified of this error in July 2015 and have been working with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality since that time for clarification and guidance to correct the problem. Kingsland Water Supply Corporation had subsequently corrected the sampling error following the August 2014 sampling event and the system was brought back into compliance.

It was determined that due to the deficiency in collecting the required samples in a timely manner, all system customers should be notified of the violation. The Notice of Violation is attached to this correspondence.

Please note that Kingsland Water Supply Corporation takes all precautions possible to insure quality safe drinking water to its system members and users at all times. Your water is sampled frequently to comply with all rules and regulations at all times. If there are any questions, please call 325-388-6611.

Triggered Source Monitoring and Reporting Violation: Ground Water Rule

<u>Kingsland Water Supply Corporation/PWS ID No. 1500012</u> failed to collect the required number of triggered source bacteriological samples for fecal indicator monitoring of the ground water system during <u>August 2014</u>. This monitoring is required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's "Drinking Water Standards" and the federal "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 95-523.

Triggered source samples are used to monitor water quality and indicate if the water is free of fecal indicator bacteria. Following a positive routine total coliform result in our distribution system, our water system is required to submit one triggered source sample for every active ground water well. Failure to collect all required triggered source samples is a violation of the monitoring requirements and we are required to notify you of this violation.

Please note, this violation occurred in August 2014, and was discovered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in July 2015. Subsequent sampling prior to this date brought the system into compliance prior to the discovery of a missing sampling event.
